VistaJet Orders Another 18 Bombardiers

Swiss-headquartered top-luxury charter operator VistaJet yesterday announced an order for 18 new Bombardier jets that takes its backlog with the Canadian manufacturer to \$1.3 billion, and which will

propel its all-Bombardier fleet beyond the 50 mark. Deliveries of the aircraft covered by the new order – a dozen long-range Challenger and Global variants and six Learjet 60s – are due to begin next year.
